UK separation from the European Union

Procedure rules:

- When referring to a MP (Member of the Parliament) from a different party: ...the honorable member of the parliament [name]...
- When referring to a MP from the same party: ...my honorable friend [name]...
- When referring to the President of the chair: ...Mr. Speaker...
- When referring to the Vice-President of the chair: ... Mr. Deputy Speaker...
- After the order of the day is elected, the only motion available will be the motion for the establishment of a permanent moderated caucus about the [order of the day].
- The topic will be discussed in a permanent moderated caucus; in-between speeches the floor will be open as long as the chair considers it necessary:
 - ✓ Motion for the introduction of an extraordinary round of questions.
 - ✓ Motion for the introduction of a formal discussion.
 - ✓ Motion for the introduction of a moderated caucus.
 - ✓ Motion for the introduction of a non moderated caucus.
 - ✓ Motion for closure of the permanent caucus about the [order of the day discussed]

A new order of the day has to be selected from the pool of options after the closure of the previous permanent caucus.

Pool of orders of the day options, susceptible for modifications by the members of the parliament or the chair:

- Political affairs
- Economic affairs
- Migration

Before the debate on the orders of the day, the parliament must agree on a European Union Referendum Act regarding the date of the referendum, the question that will be asked or if there's going to be a referendum at all. This shall not take more than **two (2) sessions**.
